How to save Big \$\$ on your Wedding Gown

Now that you are getting married, here are some tips on getting the Wedding Gown of your dreams without breaking the bank.

But sifting through the hundreds of retailers and web sites that offer you this and that can be a daunting task, finding the right company that delivers exactly what they promise.

Since the average wedding gown is around \$800, and with some top designers charging thousands for their gowns, this can be a big part of the wedding budget.

So how do I save hundreds on my gown and be sure that I am working with a reputable company.

Here's how:

You can surf the Internet. There are lots of ways to get great deals and depending upon your budget and the amount of time you have before the wedding.

If your budget and your time is limited you may have to find something off the rack at your local bridal shop, although if your really on a tight budget you might try buying from an individual on eBay although more risk involved. You may try and find designers that have an outlet store for instance I once met a bride that found her gown in San Francisco at an outlet store for \$30 dollars. So dig around a little and see what bargains you can find.

There are others ways to save on brand new designer gowns, but you have to be specific as to the designer and style number of the dress your looking for, when you narrow down the gown or gowns you can get a quote from www.dorianneveils.com they will work with you to get the wedding gown of your dreams at a deep discount So allow yourself plenty of time, some dresses when ordered take up to 30 weeks for delivery.

Don't forget to budget for the alterations

Most gowns will require some alterations whether it is a simple hem and bustle or customizing the gown. Make sure to budget \$100 to \$500 for alterations. If you are really lucky it will fit perfectly, but that is not the norm. Ask other brides for seamstress referrals as they have gone through the process already. Many bridal businesses have lists of seamstresses that they refer. If you cannot find someone in your area go to www.paccprofessionals.org, The Professional Association of Custom Clothiers, they have links to professionals in different states and areas.

Remember that every bridal manufacturer has a different size chart. And your wedding gown size is often not your normal dress size. You may have to go up one or two sizes for your wedding gown. It is better to order a bit larger, as it is easier to take the gown in than to let it out. A professional can guide you.
